

New York, NY (Nov. 24, 2013) - What do you get when you mix academia brightest minds, Street Literature and New York's most vibrant borough? The incredible story of Khalil and Rasheeda, a young couple from the South Bronx, trying to make it out of the ghetto and have a taste of the prosperity middle class Americans take for granted.

It is also the result of an incredible collaboration between Mark Naison, Professor of History and African American Studies at Fordham University and a young graduate student, Melissa Castillo-Garsow (previously at Fordham, and now

currently pursuing a PhD at Yale). When teaching a graduate class on street literature and hip hop at Fordham University, Dr. Mark Naison challenged students in the class to help him write a novel which used the non stop action of street literature to bring to life people in South Bronx neighborhoods being changed by an influx of immigrants and big money coming in from Manhattan. Melissa Castillo-Garsow, a master's student in creative writing, took up the challenge and the result is a novel unlike any written before it-- filled with violence, adventure, love, lust, greed and political commentary.

Khalil, 21, is an intelligent, respectful young man forced into Heroin dealing by circumstance. Born and raised in the Patterson Houses, he is also the main provider for his mother, two younger brothers, younger sister and her two children. Rasheeda, 19, moved to the nearby Mitchell Houses when she was 8 and has fought her whole life to stay in school and not become a statistic. Now at Lehman University she is struggling to make ends meet for her mother and younger brother as well as pay her tuition by stripping at a local club, Cheetahs. After falling behind in her tuition payments and getting suspended from work, Rasheeda breaks down in front of Khalil, revealing her intense hatred at having to strip to go to school. As a joke she suggests kidnapping her richest client, Robert Seidman, who also happens to be one of the wealthiest men on Wall Street. Powerless to help Rasheeda, Khalil takes her suggestions seriously and they hatch a plan with the help of Khalil's friends Mamadoo and Juno to kidnap and ransom Seidman. However things don't go as plan resulting in one of the most surprising and revolutionary plot twists in Street Literature history.



But it should be no surprise coming from this pair of fearless authors and activists. According to Kevin Powell, writer, hip hop activist, founder of BK Nation, "Dr. Mark Naison is one of the most important writers, thinkers, and activists we have in America. He is a fearless and tireless voice for truth and change, and one of the best examples of democratic values we've ever produced." Dr. Jason Nichols, University of Maryland at College Park and Editor of Words Beats & Life: The Global Journal Of Hip-Hop Culture, adds, "Melissa Castillo-Garsow represents the future in not only hip-hop scholarship, but academia at large. She is more than just a brilliant and meticulous researcher, but a creative young mind whose work is in the spirit of hip-hop itself."

ABOUT THE AUTHORS:

Mark Naison is Professor of History and African American Studies at Fordham University. He is the author of four books and over 200 articles on African American politics, labor history, popular culture and education policy. Dr. Naison is the Principal Investigator of the Bronx African American History Project, one of the largest community based oral history projects in the nation and has begun work on an book of oral histories from the BAAHP, with Robert Gumbs, entitled Before the Fires: An Oral History of African American Life in the Bronx from the 1030's the 1960's. His articles about Bronx music and Bronx culture have been published in German, Spanish, Catalan, and Portuguese as well as English. He has two books coming out this year, a novel Pure Bronx, written with Melissa Castillo



to

Garsow, and a book of writings on education and youth activism, *Badass Teachers Unite*, to be published by Haymarket Press.

When not doing historical research, Naison likes to play tennis and golf, post commentary on his blog, "With a Brooklyn Accent," and make periodic forays into the media. During the last five years, he has begun presenting historical "raps" in Bronx schools under the nickname of "Notorious Phd" and has been the subject of stories about his use of hip hop in teaching in the *The Daily News*, Bronx 12 Cablevision, and Fox



Business. He also comments regularly on education issues through his blog and on LA Progressive, History News Network and *The Washington Post* "Answer Sheet, and is one of the founders of three education activist sites on Facebook -"Dump Duncan," "Occupy Teach for America" and the wildly successful "Badass Teachers Association." However, some know him best for his appearance on the Chappelle Show, where his "performance" has been preserved on that show's Second Year DVD.

Melissa Castillo-Garsow is a Mexican-American writer, journalist, and scholar currently pursuing a PhD in American Studies and African American Studies at Yale University. Her short stories and poetry have been published in various journals including *The Acentos Review*, *La Bloga*, *Hispanic Culture Review*, *Hinchas de Poesia* and *The 2River View*.

Melissa completed her Master's degree in English with a concentration in Creative



Writing at Fordham University in 2011 where she was a graduate assistant for the American Studies Program. Prior to that she was awarded a Bachelor of Arts from New York University summa cum laude with a double major in Journalism and Latin American Studies. A former employee of NBC News, El Diario/ La Prensa and Launch Radio Networks, Melissa has had articles and reviews published in a wide variety of forums including CNN.com, Latin Beat Magazine, Washington Square News, University Wire, El Diario/La Prensa, Women's Studies, Words.
